Response

Our neighbourhood teams continue to lead the way across Cheshire, with shoplifting detection rates now exceeding 60% for 2026 – far above the national average and a testament to the hard work of officers and partners. You Said, We Did



Nantwich Town Centre (BD04 and BD05)

You Said: We want to see our local officers on foot patrol more often.

We Did: Our weekly Cops on the Square engagement initiative continues to grow and strengthen. Maintaining a consistent presence in the town centre has created a valuable platform for partnership working, enabling a wide range of organisations to join us in meeting and supporting the community. This developing collaboration is enhancing our visibility, improving accessibility and ensuring that the voices of our communities remain central to the work we do

Baddington Bridge, (BD01 Audlem)

You Said: What are the Police doing about HGV's ignoring the weight limit and diversion on Baddington Bridge

We Did: Since the weight restriction and associated diversion were introduced, we have worked closely with local councillors and Cheshire East Highways to address community concerns. Our team has increased visibility at the bridge, stopped a number of HGVs attempting to use the route, and shared regular updates through our Facebook page.

In recent weeks, we have also met with Highways representatives on site to support their ongoing structural assessment work.

Nantwich Town Centre ((BD04 and BD05)

You Said: What are Police doing to reduce violence against women and girls (VAWG)

We Did: Reducing violence against women and girls remains a national priority for policing. In Nantwich, we work closely with all parts of the community, from schools to parish councils, and particularly within the town's vibrant night-time economy. Through Pubwatch, we continue to promote established safety initiatives such as Ask for Angela. In March, we welcomed a range of volunteers, including the Mayor and representatives from the charity Her Place, to take part in our VAWG safety walks. These focused on the Swinemarket and Mill Island areas, where we gathered recommendations on environmental improvements designed to help ensure that those who are most vulnerable feel safer within our community.

All Nantwich beat areas

You Said: Community concerns relating to speeding vehicles on the main routes into and surrounding the town centre.

We Did: Alongside our routine Trucam speed enforcement activity, the team has continued to deliver our high visibility road safety initiative - 'Operation Deterred'. This targets three locations simultaneously and is supported by ANPR technology, enabling officers to address all elements of the Fatal Five.

The outcomes from each deployment are shared across our social media channels and are also discussed at local community meetings to ensure transparency and continued community engagement
