## You Said, We Did



### Halton Lea

**You Said:** You were seeing issues with drugs dealing around The Uplands and The Knoll area, Causing a rise in anti-social behaviour and community tensions in the area.

**We Did:** Various foot patrols which have resulted in persons stopped with drugs as well as illegal bikes seized.

6 warrants conducted throughout the quarter resulting in large quantities of drugs and cash seized and multiple persons arrested with investigations ongoing. This has seen a reduction in the antisocial behaviour in the area..

### Halton Brook

**You Said:** There have been ongoing complaints from local residents regarding anti-social behaviour at Rock Park.

**We Did:** Local officers and Halton Council have worked closely to address these concerns by increasing patrols in the area, improving the football pitch and facilities for local teenagers, and engaging with and taking action against individuals responsible for offences within the park. These measures have been implemented to improve the environment and ensure the park is a safer, more enjoyable space for the local community.

### Beechwood and Heath

**You Said:** Residents of HIGHLANDS ROAD, have reported youths causing ASB by kicking people's front doors and running off. On more than one occasion this has caused damage to residents' front doors causing fear and anxiety for those living there.

**We Did:** We have had an increased presence in the area at peak times on weekends and discussions with identified youths involved have taken place. We have increased engagement with the local community in order to explore more of their needs. Since the middle of March there have been no calls from HIGHLANDS ROAD regarding youths kicking the front doors.

### Windmill Hill and Sandymoor

**You Said:** Ongoing issues with ASB and shopliftings by youths at the Co-Op on Windmill Hill and Sandymoor. You asked for more patrols in the area and for action to be taken

**We Did:** 6 youths have been identified through CCTV and Witnesses regarding their involvement in shoplifting at both WINDMILL HILL CO-OP and SANDYMOORE CO-OP all 6 youths have been given an out of court disposal and the necessary housing authorities have been notified. One youth has been summoned to court for THEFT from WINDMILL HILL CO-OP.
