As we move into the warmer months, Warrington Neighbourhood Policing will continue to focus on the key issues residents have raised: **road safety, anti, social behaviour, and drug related crime.**

Following a recent restructure, we now have an **increased number of officers dedicated to neighbourhood policing, including a dedicated officer working with partners and schools to address anti-social behaviour.**

In line with the Neighbourhood Policing Guarantee, more officers are back on the beat, our **Town Centre Team has been strengthened to support local businesses,** and we continue to take firm action against the illegal and anti-social use of off road bikes.

You Said...Can you do something about the use of e-bikes/surons/off-road bikes in the area

We did... Acting upon intelligence and supported by the Northern Problem Solving Team, a prolific offender was arrested which triggered a Prison License Recall. The offender was linked to illegal e-bike use.

We appreciate any information that identifies either the rider or the addresses that these bikes originate from.

You Said...Can we do anything about the parking situation on Secker Avenue.

We did...After numerous complaints and liaising with residents and the local college, the college have been putting it up on the screens to remind students to park responsibly and consider local residents.

Residents are reminded that unless there are parking restrictions there is no legal remedy against a vehicle which is road legal and parked in a manner that is the same as other residents. It would be impossible to police or justify taking action against one vehicle without considering other vehicles and streets which will inevitably target residents vehicles as well.

You Said...What can be done about the parking in the Longshaw Street Area and surrounding roads.

We did... Following on from numerous residents complaints in the Longshaw Street area regarding the unreasonable actions of a local business over several months a Community Protection Warning (CPW) was issued to the business.

This warning clearly lays out the expectations Cheshire Police has on the business going forward to alleviate the concerns of the local residents.

This has resulted in a significant improvement in the immediate area and a reduction in community tensions.

You Said...What can be done about the influx of illegal cigarettes, vape shops and other traders that are having a detrimental effect on the community on Orford Lane

We did...January seen a busy month working with our partner agencies; Trading Standards, HMRC and Immigration, 10 shops in total were investigated. This resulted in 4 closure orders being served by Warrington Magistrates Court.

This means that the shops cannot open within the next 3 months at a minimum.

Engaging in disorder and criminal behaviour will NOT be tolerated in this town, and we will continue to target those committing crime, making Warrington a hostile place for criminals of all kinds.
