### Cheshire Constabulary Performance Update: January 2026 - March 2026

Figures are compared to the same period in 2025

#### Response



**4 seconds** - the average time to answer emergency calls.

**93%** of emergency incidents attended in **15 minutes**  Up **1%**

**93%** of prompt incidents attended in **60 minutes**  Up **6%**

Compared to **6 seconds** in the same period last year.

#### Crime and Incidents

**18,489** crimes recorded up by **3%** 

**51,308** incidents reported **Stayed the same** 

**5,011** arrests made up by **8%** 

**Domestic Abuse Offences** brought to justice **26%** up by **4%** 

**Sexual offences** brought to justice **19%** up by **7%** 

**All crime offences** brought to justice **26%** up by **4%**
