You Said, We Did



Ellesmere Port Town

You Said: Street drinkers in Ellesmere Port are a nuisance.

We Did: As part of Operation Remove and Operation Sidelines we have been carrying out dedicated high visibility mobile and foot patrols in Ellesmere Port Town Centre.

These operations provide Officers on duty solely to patrol the areas around ASDA, Marina Drive, Rivington Road and York Road.

These patrols are ongoing and have contributed to a reduction in the number of incidents in the Town Centre, with statistics showing that the number of reported Anti-Social Behaviour incidents (ASB) in the Town Centre has dropped by 50% between August and September 2024

Whitby

You Said: Residents have informed us through our Resident's Voice form that speeding and anti-social driving is often happening along Underwood Drive.

We Did: Local officers have conducted speed enforcement along Underwood Drive, where on one occasion 30 vehicles were captured exceeding the 20mph speed limit.

Motorists caught exceeding the roads speed limits at this time are reported to our Central Ticket Office where they will be asked to attend a 'Speed Awareness' course, receive points on their license and a fine, or be issued with a driving ban.

Rossmore

You Said: Residents reported drug dealing taking place in the area of New Grosvenor Road and Jacks Woods Avenue.

We Did: High visibility patrols have been carried out in the area. Plain clothes officers have also carried out patrols and conducted a number of stop searches. Planned police disruption activities are ongoing.

Residents are encouraged to continue reporting incidents of this nature.

Grange

You Said: Residents reported continued speeding on Overpool Road.

We Did: Enforcement has been carried out with the speed camera. - Any motorists caught exceeding the roads speed limit will be offered a 'Speed Awareness' course, (you are only allowed to take this once every three years) or points and a fine.

We will continue to carry on with these speed operations as part of our commitment to Road Safety and keeping our communities safe.

Attendees have the opportunity to examine the use of policing powers in their local community to ensure transparency, legitimacy and accountability.

The group meets once every three months to review, discuss and comment on Hate Crime, Stop Searches and Use of force incidents.
