You Said, We Did



Hartford and Greenbank

You Said: Reports of Speeding in the Hartford and Greenbank area..

We Did: Increased speed management sessions in the area at a number of relevant locations. A community speed watch group has also been set up in the area with other areas being considered for the same approach.

Witton and Rudheath

You Said: Reports of possible drug activity on a street in the Rudheath area

We did : Increased high-visibility patrols within the area, engaging with residents and gathering information, which has led to a warrant being executed and several persons being arrested.

Davenham and Moulton

You Said: Reports of ASB and youths causing issues as Leftwich Community Building.

We Did: The local PCSO has been in touch with Cheshire West and Chester Council and Northwich Town Council in regards to the building. They have advised that the building will be patrolled twice weekly by an outside company to ensure that the building remains secure. Further fencing has now been erected on the outskirts of the building.

Both Northwich Response and local Beat Officers have responded to incidents at the building, which have resulted in youths being taken home and one being arrested.

Beat officers will keep up high visibility patrols in the area .

Lostock Gralam and Shakerley

You Said: Several reports of parking issues on a street in Lostock Gralam, with vehicles causing unnecessary obstructions and parking on yellow zig-zag markings.

We Did: Local patrols spent time in this area, during which several tickets were issued in relation to parking offences.
