You Said: Drug Activity on Weaver Street

You Said: More Youth Engagement Initiatives

We Did: Winsford PCSOs worked in partnership with Winsford Youth and Community Forum representatives over the recent Summer period with their Community Canoeing Project at Winsford marina, following a successful Cheshire Crime Beat funding application for a £1000. The initiative was a fantastic way to engage with young people from a range of backgrounds at Winsford marina. Those who participated learned essential new life skills such as discipline, teamwork and confidence building on the water. In turn reducing their chances of being involved in anti-social behaviour or associated crime in the future.

You Said: On your most recent Residents Voice , YOU SAID that speeding, inconsiderate parking or other road related issues was a fairly big .

We Did: 1. **INCREASED PATROLS:** Police increased their presence during the hours when speeding was most prevalent.

2. **SPEED CAMERAS:** Mobile speed cameras were deployed at strategic points on the road.

3:**PUBLIC AWARENESS:** Social media posts were posted , indicating that the area was under surveillance for speeding. The "You Said, We Did" campaign Social Media posts also informed the public that their complaints had led to these actions.

You Said: Community Concerns Over Drug Activity

We Did: On Thursday 22nd August 2024 Winsford Beat management executed a warrant under the misuse of drugs act at an address on Severn Walk, Winsford. While at the address a 24 year old male was arrested following the seizure of class A and B drugs from the address. Also whilst officers were at the address an unregistered XL bully was seized. The occupant is currently under investigation for possession of a dangerous dog, having admitted to possession of the controlled drugs.
