You Said: Handforth summer community events

We Did: Wilmslow Officers attended multi-agencies youth engagement to help stop ASB in the area. These sessions were held every week during the summers holiday at Meriton Park and Stanley Hall Park. The funding for these sessions was source by the local PCSO from the Town Council and local housing providers.

You Said: Obstructive parking on Cliff Road.

We Did: Throughout the summer PCSO's from Wilmslow Beat team have been dealing with obstructive parking on Cliff Road to make it safe for pedestrians, prams and wheelchair users. The area was added to our hotspot patrol plan, with officers visiting regularly and issuing tickets/advisories where necessary.

Signs and cones were placed to deter parking on the pavement and due to all the above, we saw a significant decrease in obstructive parking this summer.

You Said: Burglary Prevention.

We Did: Since September 2021, Neighbourhood officers and PCSOs have been delivering Operation Fierce in the Wilmslow West and Chorley ward, which has proactively provided door-step education to residents of over 1,300 houses about methods to keep their homes and vehicles secure. Thanks to the dedication of local officers and the community, home and vehicle security in the area has improved by more than 80%, helping to make Wilmslow a hostile place for criminals. You Said: Shoplifting

We Did: Prolific shoplifter was successfully detained in July, after a foot chase through bramble and thorns, a team effort by PCs and PCSOs led to the male being arrested and over £100 of alcohol being returned to its rightful owner. The offender was linked to a total of 16 offences under investigation by multiple police forces.

Wilmslow beat team continue to work with local town centre stores along with Wilmslow BID manager from Groundwork to tackle the ongoing shoplifting.

Officers are also carrying out joint working with BTP in relation to bike thefts that have occurred at the train station and leisure centre.
